American Welding Society Foundation Awards 2007-2008 National Scholarships and Fellowships

Miami, FL, July 2, 2007 – The [American Welding Society](#) (AWS) [Foundation](#), the charitable organization of AWS, today announced the 2007-2008 recipients of the Foundation's National Scholarship and Fellowship programs. AWS is the world's largest organization dedicated to advancing the science, technology and application of welding.

The national scholarships are available to students pursuing a welding-related degree at an accredited four-year college or university, unless special criteria are specified by the donor. Each scholarship is worth a minimum of \$2,500 annually. The AWS Fellowship is awarded to students for graduate research toward a master's degree or doctorate degree under a sponsoring professor at a North American University. The fellowships are presented in amounts of up to \$25,000 per year, renewable for up to three years of research.
